#### UTT/21/3536/DFO Manor Nursery, Wimbish

Approval of reserved matters relating to access, appearance, layout and scale for four detached dwellings (approved under UTT/20/0755/OP and subsequent appeal).

The latest application provides details of the proposed buildings that received outline permission on appeal. Our concern relates to the increases in the sizes of the buildings now being proposed.

The initial application was for two detached properties with garaging and a pair of semi-detached properties with open parking spaces. No details were given of the number of bedrooms in each property but it was stated that the combined footprint of the four properties would be 564 sqm.

The latest proposal is for **four detached five bedroomed** properties. No details of the footprints are given. However some approximate measurements based on the block plans provided would indicate increases in the footprint for Plot 1 of 20-30%, Plot 2 of 50%, whilst the footprints for Plots 3 and 4 appear to have at last doubled and possibly trebled.

The district needs more smaller properties and we consider these latest proposals are considerably and significantly different to what was agreed and out of step with the needs of the district.
